It is Crisis Connections International's, (CCI), team belief that suicide is generally preventable, the mission of CCI is to help reduce the incidents of suicide through greater access to information and resources. To achieve this mission, CCI recognizes that suicide prevention and intervention is a process involving many community resources.

It is iCrisis' objective to:

- 1. Provide instant access to information and resources
- 2. Reduce Suicide Rates
- 3. Educate the public about suicide prevention and intervention
- 5. Respect for all those in need or suicidal.

The causes of suicide are complex and include a range of factors, not all of which are always apparent.

According to a University of California, Berkeley Study in 2018, correctional officers are at a high risk for depression, PTSD and suicide.

The study, which focuses on California state prisons, and a survey conducted in 2017 showed that 10% of correctional officers said they'd considered taking their own life. Among adults in the U.S., about 3% reported having suicidal thoughts, while retired correctional officers, according to the study, reported a rate of 31%.

About 1 in 3 are dealing with PTSD, according to the study, as about half of the correctional officers surveyed reporting that the don't feel safe at work. Depression also affects about one-third of the officers.

We at iCrisis have heard this too many times...

Correctional Officers (CO's) have the second highest mortality rate of any occupation.

33.5% of all assaults in prisons and jails are committed by inmates against staff

- A CO's 58th birthday, on average, is their last.
- A CO will be seriously assaulted at least twice in a 20 year career.
- On average a CO will live only 18 months after retirement.
- CO's have a 39% higher suicide rate than any other occupation,
- And have a higher divorce and substance abuse rates then the general population


